The two parables relate to the relationship between Jesus' teaching and traditional Judaism. According to some interpreters, <u>Jesus here "pits his own, new way against</u> the old way of the Pharisees and their scribes."

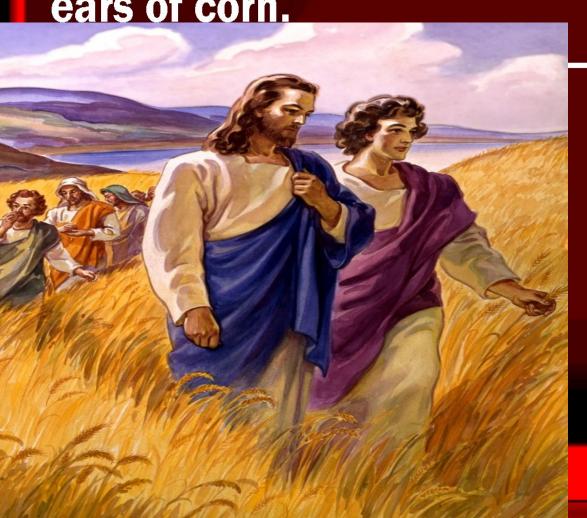
Other interpreters see Luke as giving Christianity roots in Jewish antiquity, although "Jesus has brought something new, and the rituals and traditions of official Judaism cannot contain it."

In his commentary on Matthew, Mark, and Luke, John Calvin states that the old wineskins and the old garment represent Jesus' disciples, and the new wine and unshrunk cloth represent the practice of fasting twice a week. Fasting this way would be burdensome to the new disciples, and would be more than they could bear.

Based on parallel rabbinic sayings found in Pirkei Avot, one <u>interpreter sees the</u> <u>parable as depicting the difficulty of teaching disciples with prior learning as compared to teaching new, uneducated disciples.</u>

The metaphors in the two parables <u>were drawn from contemporary culture</u>. New cloth had not yet shrunk, so that using new cloth to patch older clothing would result in a tear as it began to shrink. Similarly, old wineskins had been "stretched to the limit" or become brittle as wine had fermented inside them; using them again therefore

The Sabbath was made for mankind, to serve mankind, and therefore it also serves God's purpose. Notice that He does not say the Sabbath was made for the Jews only, as most people read into this. Some also say that Jesus kept the Sabbath because He was a Jew, but that is merely a dodge. God says what He means. Jesus clearly understood He was to keep it, and He did.

If it were God's intent that only Jews keep it, Jesus would have stated it that way.

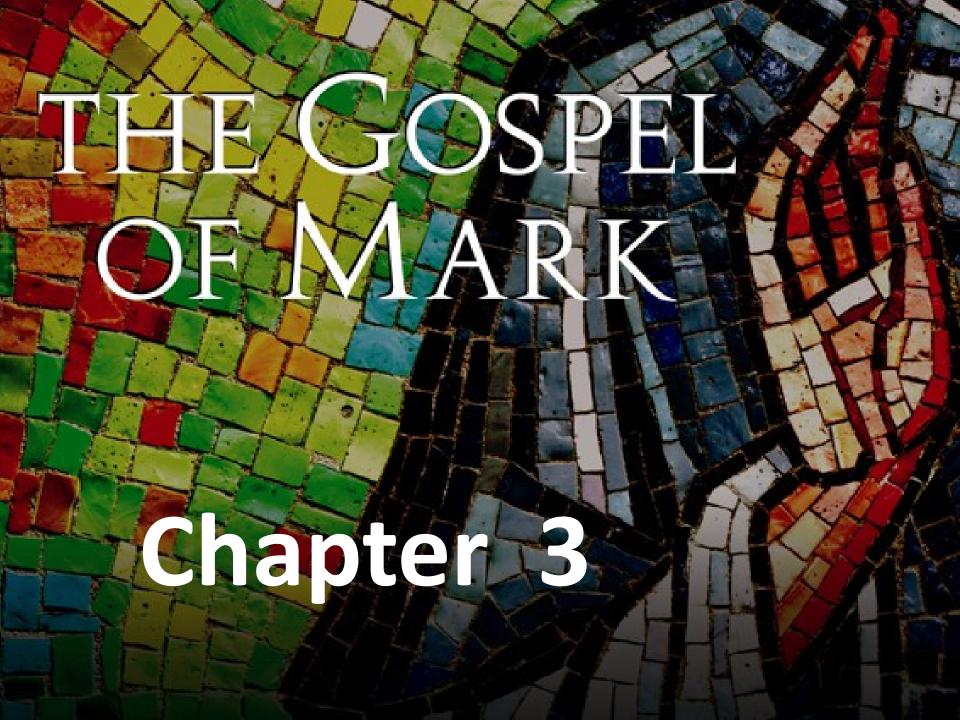
Therefore the Son of man is Lord also of the sabbath.

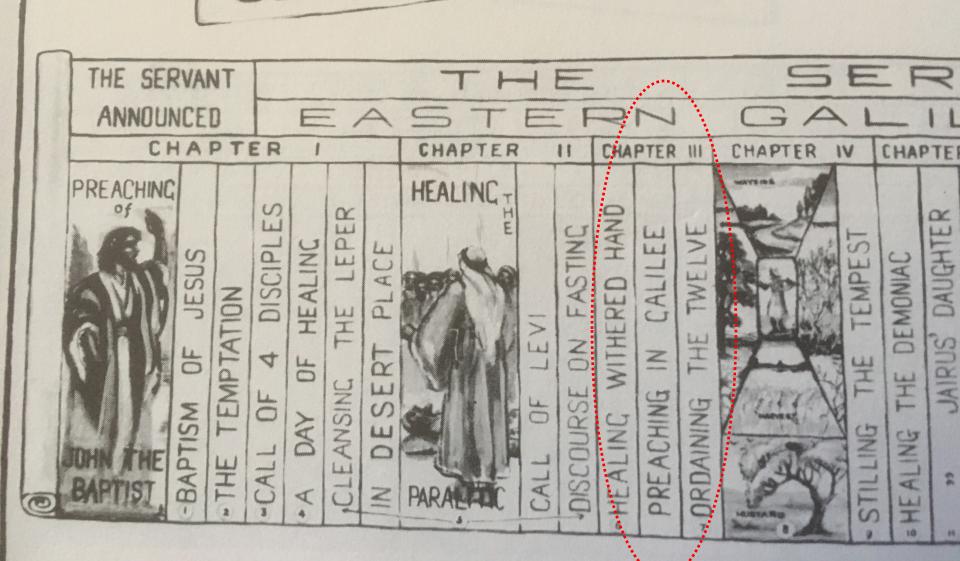
