THE HERODIANS



The Herodians were more a political than religious party. They were Jews who attached themselves to the political fortunes of the Herodian family, hoping thereby to promote the interests of the Jewish people. They were loose in observing Jewish rituals, and though in this respect they were the opposite of the Pharisees, they easily fell in with them in efforts to ruin Jesus. If Jesus spoke against the Romans, the Herodians would run His statements back to the authorities and Jesus would be taken into custody.

And when they were come, they say unto him, Master, we know that thou art true, and carest for no man: for thou regardest not the person of men, but teachest the way of God in truth: Is it lawful to give tribute to Caesar, or not?







Who were the Sadducees?


- The wealthy aristocrats who held the majority of seats in the Sanhedrin (Jewish supreme court).
- The high priest and the chief priests were Sadducees.
- Usually agreed with Romans to keep the peace.
- Denied the resurrection of Jesus.
- Did not believe in any afterlife.
- Denied the existence of a spiritual world.

Master, Moses wrote unto us, If a man's brother die, and leave his wife behind him, and leave no children, that his brother should take his wife, and raise up seed unto his brother.

⁵¶ If brethren dwell together, and one of them die, and have no child, the wife of the dead shall not marry without unto a stranger: her husband's brother shall go in unto her, and take her to him to wife, and perform the duty of an husband's brother unto her.

⁶ And it shall be, *that* the first-born which she beareth shall succeed in the name of his brother *which is* dead, that his name be not put out of Israel.






MARRIAGE =


MAN + BROTHER'S WIDOW (LEVIRATE MARRIAGE) Genesis 38:6-10

- It is in knowing and loving God that we can truly live in our life.







Mark's Gospel

- Mark records how the crowds reacted to Jesus' teaching when He confronted the religious authorities.
- After Jesus had silenced the Temple authorities and lawyers by His answers to their trick questions, Mark records, "....And the common people heard Him gladly." (Mark 12:37, NKJV)
- The ordinary people were delighted that Jesus had caused the chief priests and Pharisees to lose face in a big way.



And he said unto them in his doctrine, Beware of the scribes, which love to go in long clothing, and love salutations in the marketplaces,





This reading of Mark 12:38-13:2, certainly calls to mind the Prophecy of Malachi 3 where the Lord suddenly appears in the temple (3:1) and confronts in judgment "those who wrong the widow and the fatherless" as well as those who cheat the laborer of his wages and those who thrust aside the alien (3:5). All of these are related to charges Jesus brought against those who were running the Temple.
